



Doctoral agreement of the Faculty of Psychology and Human Movement Science for conducting doctoral projects

This supervision agreement is concluded between the doctoral candidate and the supervisors of the doctoral project and is kept at least until the completion of the procedure. It contains the provisional title and topic of the dissertation as well as information on the targeted doctoral degree (Dr. phil. or Dr. sportwiss.) with reasons for the indicated choice.

It serves to ensure a high quality of academic education and to guarantee the best possible supervision and support for doctoral candidates. It also sets out the rights and obligations of the parties involved.

- (1) After receiving the confirmation of supervision from the first supervisor, the doctoral candidate compiles the required documents (see PO § 4 (1)) and submits them via the doctoral database (Docata).
- (2) The doctoral committee examines the application for admission to doctoral studies and admits the candidate to the doctorate for Dr. phil. or Dr. sportwiss. After admission, enrollment takes place.
- (3) The doctoral candidate and the first supervisor agree to regularly meet (at least every six months) to discuss the status of the dissertation project, any necessary modifications or updates and any issues that have been encountered or have been emerging.
- (4) The doctoral candidate is obligated to provide the first supervisor, upon request, information or access to the dissertation text, studies, survey materials, databases, and similar materials referred to in the dissertation text at any time.
- (5) The first supervisor will regularly give the doctoral candidate the opportunity to present the progress of the dissertation project in an appropriate setting. The doctoral candidate will take advantage of this opportunity.

(6) The first supervisor assists the doctoral candidate with advice and academic guidance. He/she supports him/her in working on the dissertation quickly. He/she gives advice on the quality of the interim results, points out errors/changes and supports participation in subject-related events (e.g. specialist conferences, meetings, workshops).

(7) The first supervisor promotes the possibility of publishing results from the dissertation project, also as first author.

(8) The first supervisor shall design the thesis in such a way that it can be completed within ____ years (guideline is 3-5 years) and the doctoral candidate shall normally complete the dissertation in German or English within this period, unless a different period or an extension has been agreed by mutual consent.

(9) The doctoral candidate shall inform the first supervisor in good time before the intended submission of the dissertation to the doctoral committee of the Institute of Human Movement Science

(10) In the event of an interruption lasting longer than three months or if the doctoral thesis is discontinued, the doctoral candidate shall inform the first supervisor immediately. The supervisor will inform the doctoral candidate immediately if he/she leaves the University of Hamburg. The further procedure will be determined individually.

Supplement for the supervision agreement

- This supervision agreement may be terminated at any time by mutual consent.
- Both parties agree that no legal claim on a successful doctorate can be derived from this agreement.
- In case of discrepancies or problems with the progress of the doctoral project / dissertation, the doctoral committee of the Institute of Human Movement Sciences is available for mediation.
